Celebrating Washington

So many Brothers assisted in making Washington's 288th Birthday a special event. The Light Horse Harry Lee Chapter of the Heroes of '76, the Highlanders of Kena Shrine, the National Sojourners, the George Washington Masonic National Memorial Association, Fredericksburg Lodge, No. 4, Washington Lodge, No. 21 (NY), and the Grand Lodge of Virginia assisted in making our wreath laying ceremony very special and very well attended. We concluded Lodge-specific activities with a luncheon in Grand Masonic Hall. Happy Birthday, George!





A New G

Over the past three years, the Lodge has put a great deal of effort into changing the G that hangs in the Lodge room. Our former G was installed when this room was fitted out during the Memorial's construction. We estimate that it was somewhere between 75 and 85 years old. Well, that just wasn't old enough for us.

Our wonderful collection includes an early Nineteenth Century gas lantern with a stunning cobalt blue G. Originally fashioned by John Curtis in Philadelphia, the lantern was used when the Lodge met at Alexandria's City Hall. It was one of the first gas lanterns used in a Lodge room and is made more unique by the fact that we have a decent amount of information about the manufacturer.

We have reproduced that G, installed LED lighting, and encased it in a manner befitting our Lodge Room. The glass was reproduced by Jed Boertlein, a third-generation glass artist and owner of Washington Art Glass Studio. The studio has worked in hundreds of Washington churches, synagogues, museums, the United States Capitol, and many homes and restaurants in the area over the years. The casing was built, gilded, and installed by independent artist Dean Kahn, who specializes in conservation treatments of fine picture frames, woodwork, and gilt objects. His client list includes National Gallery of Art, Smithsonian National Museum of African American History and Culture, White House Collection, Carnegie Institution, Philadelphia Museum of Art, National Constitution Center, Masonic Museum and Library of Pennsylvania, Museum of the American Revolution, and numerous private collections.



These efforts were the brainchild of Right Worshipful Mark Underwood, the toiling of Worshipful Nikola Nikolov, under the careful



watch of Worshipful Tom McMahan, our Archives Committee Chairman, and Mr. Steve Stuart, our Lodge Archivist. All along the way, Right Worshipful Mike Bible and Wor. Froggett inserted themselves to assist with the project and finally see it through to fruition. We were pleased and honored to have Most Worshipful Douglas Vernon Jones with to assist in its debut on George Washington's Birthday. Many thanks to Bros. Shawn Eyer and Adam Smartt for the photos.
