

We have an historical bond with this lodge for 225 years since our participation with the cornerstone ceremony of the U.S. Capitol in 1793. Illustrious Brother George Washington with Alexandria Lodge No. 22, Federal Lodge No. 1 and Potomac Lodge No. 5, laid the cornerstone for this edifice of the New Republic and Democracy on September 18, 1793. 

Brother C.R. "Chuck" Dunning. Jr is the author of Contemplative Masonry: Basic Applications of Mindfulness, Meditation, and Imagery for the Craft. He has been a Master Mason since 1988. His mother lodge is Haltom City-Riverside #1331, in Haltom City, Texas, and he is also a member of Albert Pike #162 in Guthrie, Oklahoma. Chuck is a Full Member of the Texas Lodge of Research, and belongs to a number of other Masonic research societies. In the Scottish Rite, Chuck is a Knight Commander of the Court of Honor, Director of Education for the Guthrie Valley in Oklahoma, and a Class Director for the Fort Worth Valley in Texas. In 2012 he became the founding Superintendent of the Academy of Reflection, which is a chartered organization for Scottish Rite Masons wanting to integrate contemplative practice with their Masonic experience. He is a member of the Society for Contemplative Mind in Higher Education, and has been engaged in various forms of contemplative practice for over three decades.
