I look forward to seeing you all in Lodge and on Zoom this month. I pray for the health of all of our members and the discovery of a vaccine to break us from the shackles of the virus.



It was supposed to cover the first 100 years of the lodge but ended up covering only 93 years, 1783 - 1876.

Face Covering Use

Before/ During Use:



Before putting on a face covering, clean hands with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.



Inspect the condition of the face covering; usually the colored side/the side with folds facing downwards of the face covering should face outwards.



Cover nose, mouth, and chin with the face covering. Adjust nose clip over the nose and tighten snugly; ensure there are no gaps between face and covering.



Avoid touching the face covering. If touched, clean hands with soap and water or alcoholbased hand sanitizer.

After Use:



Remove face covering from behind using the elastics (do not touch the front of the face covering).



Discard immediately in a trash bin; replace face covering if damp. Do not re-use singleuse face coverings.



Clean hands with soap and water or alcoholbased hand sanitizer.

Practicing Good Hygiene

Protect Yourself & Others:

- Stay home when sick.
- Wash hands often.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick. Cover coughs & sneezes with a tissue; throw the
- tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Maintain at six feet between yourself & others.

Wash Your Hands:



- At least 20 second with soap and water or use an alcohol-based (60% alcohol) hand sanitizer.
- After coughing, sneezing, or blowing your nose.
- Before, during, and after preparing & eating food.
- After visiting the bathroom.
