



THE MASTER'S MESSAGE

My Dear Brethren-

All of the core doctrine, rules, and charges of Freemasonry are contained in this slim, 96 page book. Even though we do not speak overtly of Anderson's very often, it plays a huge and central role in Virginia Freemasonry. In addition to the Anderson's unveiling, we will be pleased to receive Right Worshipful Brother Douglas M. Woodley, District Deputy Grand Master for Masonic District 1A. RW Woodley has taken time out of his busy schedule to join us and to present some thoughts on behalf of the Grandmaster. As always, if you plan on attending the Festive Board following the meeting,
