

The Alexandria – Washington Lodge, No. 22, Foundation, Inc., has been established to support specific operations of the Lodge and preservation of our museum collection. This is an exciting first step toward elevating our museum collection to the level of scholarship and care worthy of the many important Washington, Early American, and Masonic artifacts that we possess. The Foundation provides an avenue for tax-deductible donations to the Lodge, establishes a 501(c)3 status that will allow us to apply for grants, and demonstrates our willingness to further invest in the health and future of the Lodge. Completing the incorporation papers and filing official bylaws make the Foundation fully functional and ready to get to work.

Within the next month, the Foundation Board of Directors will announce opportunities for every member of the Lodge to get involved and efforts to raise preservation and education funding from outside sources. There is much work to be done to refresh museum displays in the Replica Lodge Room, educational efforts that can be accomplished through the production of items for the Gift Shop, and opportunities to send our collection out into various community museums. Financially supporting the Lodge's sharing of the stories of Washington and Freemasonry while celebrating this important milestone in the Memorial's life is central to fulfilling the Foundation's purpose.

We are humbled by the generosity and faith that we have received in our initial donation. Wor. Jesse T. McMahan, PM and Foundation Director, contributed \$10,000 to the foundation to demonstrate his support for the outlined purposes and to encourage the entire Lodge to consider its potential. Funding the ability to use our collection and stature as a Lodge to educate our community, our country, and even the world, is a cause worthy of support. Dissemination of the Masonic ideals embodied by Washington will undoubtedly inspire everyone who encounters them. Our opportunity is now, and by funding the opportunity now, we ensure the creation of additional opportunities in the future.
