

Art Escaping the Archives

Preparing the Lodge for February 2023

Thank you to everyone who provided feedback on the plan to get more of our collection back on display. Artwork, works on paper, and textiles do benefit from periods of rest, away from light. We have a number of pieces in the collection that have been resting for some time. As we prepare for 2023, we want to get those items back in public areas. We are also taking this opportunity to change how we interpret Masonry in the Replica Lodge Room.

The most substantial change is the move of the John Gadsby Chapman Master's Carpet from the Lodge Room to the Replica Lodge Room. In this first stop of the Memorial tour, the carpet will be much more visible and a tool for guides to share the meaning of many Masonic symbols. In addition, owing to the importance of Chapman's work, it connects our collection to the US Capitol. In the Lodge Room, we have asked Bro. Dimitar Mavrov to refresh and update the Degree Trestleboards he created some years back. They will be featured on the North Wall and the Albion Hurdle Masonic regalia portraits of Washington and Lafayette will move from the Ante Room to the South Wall. Bro. Mavrov has transformed the back hallway into an art studio.



We are keeping to the loose tradition of the Lodge Ante Room being a portrait gallery and will be moving various portraits around to fill the space. For the first time in years, the portraits of Mary Ball Washington, Washington's mother, and Nelly Custis, Washington's step granddaughter, will return to the

Ante Room walls. A portrait of Washington's older half brother Lawrence will move from the replica room to the Ante Room. Many pieces are being shuffled to give our visitors a fresh new look at our art.

Research is underway for an exciting new museum exhibit that will go in the ante room of the Replica Lodge Room and we are working diligently to produce museum tags for all pieces on display. Our collection is important for a number of reasons, but most of all its ability to educate the public on Freemasonry, George Washington, and the role of the Lodge in our community. Our new tags will emphasize these points. One section of the exhibit will include old Lodge signage—the sign below last hung over the Lodge Door at the Memorial. Bro. Mayrov professionally cleaned it for us and we are excited to hang it again.
