#### Brethren -

### ALBUM OF THE MONTH

IN THE MOUNTAIN IN THE CLOUD, 2011 PORTUGAL. THE MAN.



This year we will have an Album of the Month featured in each bulletin. These albums have been handpicked to reflect my personality, serve as an invigorating exploration into one of the seven liberal arts we are exposed to in the Fellowcraft degree, and is a unique way for future generations to explore our era. Also, I think this is just a fun way to share one of my passions. Listen to each album on your way to lodge and enjoy unique perspectives on this artform.

There is a fear of winter that is so ancient and universal that it predates mankind itself. This is the time when the day must battle against the imperious dominion of night; when life hides itself away in the warrens and burrows and caves and deep, black waters that offer refuge from the killing frosts; when elders tell tales of starving Wendigos, which prowl amongst the naked trees in search of manflesh, and we know deep down that every word the elders tell is truth. This is the time when foolhardy men, self-assured in their invincibility, venture out into the bleak snowscape- for roots or for beer, it doesn't matter-and are left gibbering and naked as Winter's palm encloses them in the false warmth of her grasp. This is the time when the ground freezes and the dead are left unburied until the spring thaw. It is the time when the air itself hangs motionless around us, either in reverence or in stark horror of the calamity that the killing time, the dying time, brings to the land and waters. Winter is the suspension of life; the cessation of movement; the time ordained by God neither for reaping nor sowing, but for surviving on the fruits of the labors

one has produced the rest of the year-round. In a sense, winter can itself be viewed as a force of justice—or of retribution, as it may be. Winter is the midnight that belongs neither to the day that preceded it, nor to the day that follows it.

But, just as the hands on a clock inevitably sweep past midnight, and the children who held their breath during this suspicious, even cursed, period exhale giddily once they are safe from the witches and devils that lurk inside that long minute, so too does winter subside—its Angel-of-Death hands bound once more by the forces of nature and the might of the coming springtide, which visits a renaissance upon the barren wasteland winter has manufactured.

In this way, winter plays a role—a stock character—in the cosmic kabuki of our universe. It is that season which completes the cycle of our year, just as midnight is the hour that completes the cycle of our day, and just as the Angel of Death completes the cycle of our lives. It is the last stage of the karmic wheel, where we are forced to put down the tools of our trades—be they swords, or scythes, or pens—and be judged accountable for the consequences we have wrought through the actions of our lives.

The album In the Mountain, in the Cloud by Portugal, the Man is an ode to the resurrection that winter portends—a psychedelic, aural fantasia refracting the glory of spring through the white diamond of winter and tinted in the blood spilled through mutual misunderstanding. Though it sonically evokes David Bowie, the lyrics themselves are of the wistful, probing sort as found on Neil Young's After the Gold Rush, where the fulfillment of animal necessity has left an absence of purpose (see, from ITMITC: "Got It All (This Can't Be Living Now)"). The title of the album lends itself to the universality and interconnectedness of these cycles, be they expressed earthily (the mountain) or ethereally (the cloud).

There is a concept in eastern religions called samsara that encapsulates the endless repetition of birth, growth, decline, and death experienced in micro-and macrocosm on every observable level of the universe. To some, this ouroboros is interpreted as proof of the meaningless of intentionality and effort, and of life itself. To Portugal, the Man, it is the inextinguishable promise that, just as the dawn destroys the night, the spring will—not may, but will—defeat the winter. More than that, the album poises the concepts represented by winter and spring not as enemies destined to battle one another, but rather as ideological phrases which resolve one another harmoniously.

Take, for example, the first song on the record, "So American," which speaks of a Christ with a "mission and a gun to paint rainbows in Vietnam." Here is expressed a corruption of the necessarily symbiotic rela-

tionship between winter and spring—a misdirected would-be savior enacting violence against the soul of the world under the delusion of manifesting peace. It speaks to the nefarious manipulation of man's purpose and nature's function by those who would seek to use them to further their own selfish goals (also expressed in "Head is a Flame (Cool with It)". This manipulation disrupts the harmony of winter and spring and leaves them in discord. In this instance, winter, the role of which is to claim the frail and the unprepared, has been weaponized for imperial gain, creating conflict with the function of spring, which is to give rise to new hope and replenish the fruit of the earth. The natural function of these seasons may be best exemplified by Jesus Christ Himself, who sacrificed Himself yet was resurrected anew, giving hope and salvation to the world. Thus, we see midnight ticking over to a new day; thus, we see winter turn into spring. The corruption of the Christ in this song is a literary device to exemplify how human beings have disturbed the harmony of nature through war, avarice, and blind allegiance to those perennially out of sync with the divine truth of the universe. The imposition of this cosmic perversion inevitably leads to the despondency and hopelessness expressed in the album's "Sleep Forever," which occupies the final slot in the track listing and in which the narrator has rejected his position in nature and wishes to be omitted from the universe in its entirety for the evils that have been falsely presented to him as truths.

Later, in that same song, the perspective changes from Jesus Himself to one learning from "the one they call Jesus Christ" (it is important to note that every time this name is brought up, it is context of "the one they call Jesus Christ," which may itself point to the insincerity of the moniker), who insists that "He was born of all the mothers and the colors of our brothers." This harkens to the universality of human nature, human experience, and, therefore, the cycle in which we all play a part.
