The Trowel

Before we delve into the meaning of the Trowel we first must note the iconic <u>George Washington Trowel</u>[1] kept in our Archives. This Trowel was used by Brother George in the laying of the Corner Stone of the Capitol Building and many other



Iconic Buildings. If you follow the hyperlink above, a brilliant history of the GW Trowel can be found on the AW22 website.

We as Masons should be examples among our neighbors, friends and loved ones on how to unite our communities by what we have in common, not by what separates us. This is exactly why we engage the public and are outbound in our charity to our local community! How can we unite a community if we sow the seeds of disharmony?

In The Craft and Its Symbols, author Allen E. Roberts notes of the trowel that a Master Mason "is taught to use it differently than his operative brethren. Instead of spreading cement, the Master Mason uses it symbolically to spread Brotherly Love and Affection. By doing this the Mystic Tie of Freemasonry becomes more binding. Its members are truly united into a Temple of Living Stones."[2]

Our local community is no longer that 10-mile radius around our homes. Our communities are broader and can often be found online. As such, it is imperative that we should always hold ourselves and each other to a higher standard. Whatever we do, be it online, or out in public, we represent not only our Lodge (and what a Lodge it is!), but the entire Craft. Mackey's explanation is one of my favorites on this subject.

In his Revised Encyclopedia of Freemasonry, Albert Mackey suggests that the trowel is especially appropriate for the Master Mason, "because, in Operative Masonry, while the Apprentice is engaged in preparing the rude materials, which require only the gage and gavel to give them their proper shape, the FellowCraft places them in their proper position by means of the Plumb, Level, and Square; but the Master Mason alone, having

examined their correctness and proved them true and trusty, secures them permanently in their place by spreading with the trowel, the cement that irrevocably binds them together." [3][1]

What does all that mean? I contend Brothers that it exemplifies that there is so much more that unites us than separates us. It is our duty as Masons to ensure we seek that out and be the cement that binds together. If you ever get the chance to read Wilmshurst, and I hope you do, Wilmshurst makes the argument in "Meaning of Masonry" that we ourselves are the Temple (not made with hands) which we are laboring to build. Only in harmony and not disharmony can we achieve that goal.

According to Mental Health America, 50 million US adults suffer from some form of mental illness. That's 19.86% of the adult population that struggles in some way with a mental health condition, of which, more than half do not receive any sort of treatment. With nearly 1 in 5 American adults having a diagnosable mental health condition, the need for mental health awareness grows with every passing day.

With most physical, chronic illnesses, like Cancer, Asthma, Heart Disease, or Crohn's Disease, treatment begins immediately to address the symptoms and provide greater longevity to those suffering. When someone begins to experience the beginning stages of a disease and exhibit symptoms like shortness of breath, a tightening chest, or stomach pain, care is taken to quickly treat those symptoms so that they do not turn into something greater.

The same mentality should be taken when addressing mental health conditions. As soon as someone begins to exhibit symptoms such as, feeling depressed, feeling sluggish all the time, feeling anxious, losing sleep, or thinking of committing suicide, it is imperative to provide that same intervention as one would when being treated for something physical. Initially, early symptoms may be fleeting, and possibly may even go away on their own. However, when the symptoms do not disappear, ignoring them without the right treatment can cause them to manifest into something much more devastating, that not only affects the individual, but those around them, too.

Our goal at Alexandria-Washington #22 is to provide insights into various mental health conditions so that those struggling can identify how they are feeling, and seek the proper treatment available. As a fraternal organization, we are charged with looking after one another as much as we can, and as far as our abilities may permit. We aim to assist those in need, and want to offer information that may prove beneficial to those looking for assistance, to provide that support that will help those in living full and rewarding lives.
