# Feast of St. John the Baptist: A Day of Masonic Celebration

St. John the Baptist is a major figure in Christian, Islamic, Druid, Bahá'í, and Gnostic tradition. The Catholic Church assigns feast days as being days of a saint's death, but there are two notable exceptions: the birthdays of Mary and St. John the Baptist. June 24 was <u>selected because</u> it is three months after Gabriel told Mary that her cousin, Elizabeth, was carrying the child that would become St. John the Baptist. Focusing on his most important role in the New Testament, John is considered a forerunner to Jesus and the one who Baptizes him in the Jordan River. According to <u>Matthew 11</u>, while John is imprisoned for criticizing Herod Antipas, Jesus regards John highly, saying, "there hath not risen a greater than John the Baptist."

Much like the origins of Freemasonry, the adoption story of St. John the Baptist as a patron saint is murky. <u>St. Thomas the Apostle</u> seems to have been a more natural fit as he is the patron saint of <u>stonemasons</u>. The <u>Regus Poem</u> references the <u>Four Crowned Martyrs</u>, but not St. John. Perhaps the tie to St. John descends from the builders of the Cologne Cathedral who called themselves the <u>Fraternity of St. John the Baptist</u>. Whatever the case, the <u>Premier Grand Lodge of England</u> was founded on June 24, 1717 and it has been a special date on the Masonic calendar ever since. Alexandria-Washington Lodge No. 22 has a storied history of celebrating this feast, most notably <u>electing</u> George Washington to membership in 1784.

While understanding the religious and historical roots of this day are important, the intent of this article is to persuade you to hold the day in the highest of esteem.

Much like the pagan inspired symbology of the day, with the sun being at its zenith, Masons too should view the day as the culmination of a year of Masonic work. View the day as a high point in the year for accomplishing what you set out to do in the context of Masonry. Did you put in the time this year to be all that you can be? Are you still on your journey to become a perfect ashlar? Use the day as a due date for reading that Masonic book you have been meaning to read, becoming closer to the Great Architect,

or finally paying your dues. Submit your work on the 23rd, take the 24th off to celebrate the work you and your brothers accomplished in the year, and then get back to work on your next task at hand on the 25th.

There are "days" for just about everything. National Smoothie Day, National Insurance Day, National I Love My Dentist Day, National Ballpoint Pen Day....the list devolves into the absurd. Why not a day of Freemasonry? Surely the institution of Freemasonry is more deserving of a special day than the ballpoint pen...right? Here is the call to make St. John the Baptist Day "Great Again". Post a picture of your lodge on Facebook. Wear a Masonic t-shirt to the grocery store. Mention Masonry to the guy you like in the accounting department at work. Advertise that you are proud to be a Mason for all the hard work you do to improve your inner self and your community. It is a day to be proud of the institution you represent.

Finally, it should be a day to metaphorically follow John the Baptist's example in <u>Mark 1:27</u> "He it is, who coming after me is preferred before me, whose shoe's latchet I am not worthy to unloose." Do a quick Google search about Masonic happenings and you hear of the sky falling about the <u>decline in membership</u>, <u>loss of social standing</u>, or <u>political infighting</u>. Masonry's only hope for the future is to believe and act that Masonry's best times are in the future, not the past. Are you willing to walk in the wilderness, subsist on locust and honey, and lay the way for the coming of better times?

Looking around, I believe the answer is yes, which is a fact I am looking forward to celebrating with you at Gadsby's on the 24th.
